PLAINS CONSERVATION CENTER



This is a call for artists who are members of the 51 federally recognized Tribal Nations associated with Colorado, as well as artists from Tribal communities whose members were displaced or who were relocated to the Denver Metro area of Colorado through the Indian Relocation Act of 1956.

The Plains Conservation Center is a 1,100-acre outdoor education facility and nature preserve in Aurora, Colorado, dedicated to preserving and interpreting the ecology of the shortgrass prairie. The site features replicas of a homestead village and tipi camp that reflect the lives of Plains Native American communities and pioneer settlers during the late 1800s.
