INTRODUCTIONS AND GETTING STARTED

- At the start of the event, the panel facilitators in each panel room will

 - o Give a brief overview of the event:
 - Hour one is a panel return whose goal is to share plans and knowledge about how arts orgs can return to work: sanitizing, security, distancing, and other concerns; and
 - Hour two is a break out about 10 people in each breakout whose goal is to empower arts leaders to talk to each other about questions and approaches to returning to work.

 providing a vocal, two-minute warning to panelists and asking them to stop if they
 exceed 12 min.
- Please have attendees hold questions until all presentations are complete, or ask them
 to put questions in the text chat to be addressed after the presentations.

PROMPTS FOR THE PANELISTS

These prompts were previously shared with the panelists to help them prepare for the event.

- How your organization has prepared protocols and changes in operations and programs
- How your organization rolled out changes or implemented them; and how they are working so far
- Items to consider discussing include:
 - Security
 - Sanitizing procedures
 - Staffing levels and roles
 - Audience perception of safety
 - General safety concerns for artists, audiences, and staff

- o Guidance or information you received from outside your organization
- Anything else you feel is important

 After introductions and panelist presentations, there should be about 20 minutes remaining in hour 1 for open Q&A. Please facilitate questions by reading them out of the chat or calling on folks who raise their hand.
